Dear parents,

Many of you have heard over the weekend via social media, that Mrs Vosper's husband sadly passed away last Thursday. I told staff of the news on Friday morning just before school and I am sure you can appreciate that this was a difficult time for all of us. I met with Mr Mills as Chair of Governors on Friday afternoon and then contacted the rest of the Governing body. I will be leading a short assembly this morning to explain the situation to the children in classes 2 -4.

I want to reiterate the reassurances you were given by the Governors in their letter last week that the smooth running of the school will not be disrupted by Mrs Vosper's absence and that the children's education will continue to be of a high standard.

Class 4 will continue to be taught computing by Mrs Munday on a Monday afternoon and PE will continue to be taught by Mrs Goldsmith on Mondays and Fridays. Tuesday afternoon lessons will be taught by Mrs Cork and she and I will plan the work together to ensure that I still have an overview of what the children are learning. She is, as many of you know, a very experienced teacher who knows Scole school well.

Please come and talk to me about any concerns you have, either on the playground at the start of the day or by popping into the classroom after school.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank both the staff and governors for their continued support.

Finally, well done to all the children who brought donations to the Harvest festival at St. Andrew's on Thursday. It was lovely to see so many parents – our biggest turnout yet! Thank you also to the Friends committee, who once again organised a lovely MacMillan coffee morning on Friday. Well done everyone who either sent along their delicious cakes or came for a natter and a cuppa! A super £250 was raised for this worthwhile cause.
